Rest in Peace, John Gallo

have known John Gallo since 1977 - but didn't know it until 1987! When I was gifted with sobriety in 1977 in the North Hollywood area. there was a men's recovery home known as Chandler Lodge. During my first year in A.A., I became the "Speaker Seeker" for the Wednesday Night Speaker Meeting held at the Lodge. John Gallo was a resident there at that time, but I did not know him personally. Fast forward to Fall of 1987 when Kathy and John moved to the High Desert and became active in our A.A. Community. It didn't take long for John and I to compare notes and realize we got sober with the same people and knew many of the "A.A. Gurus" who were popular at that time. Several memories have flooded back since John's illnesses and final passing on September 13, 2009.

Among some of my favorites was John's dedication to H & I and taking panels from the High Desert to Warm Springs. John made a special point to make sure I joined them during a spring event hosted by The Friends of Warm Springs, an A.A. outreach that brought outside meetings inside. John knew that it would probably be the last time I would be able to see and say goodbye to the now late Larry Lindell. Larry is the A.A. member who, in 1977, gave me permission to laugh! I cried so much my first months that it took Larry to tell me it was okay to smile. Thanks, John, for giving me that opportunity. Another time recalled fondly by Kathy and I was when we were once again going to Warm Springs during the Winter months and crossed the Tehachapi Pass and were treated to God's special version of a

"Currier & Ives Christmas Card," because John Gallo was out of self and into service.

On February 10, 2001, one of my best friends in A.A., Bob Chenoweth, passed away sober. We were only 24 hours apart in our sobriety dates and were looking forward to celebrating 24 YEARS of sobriety together the following month. I had a great amount of difficulty "accepting what I could not change." I went into a "funk." Kathy and John were active on the High Desert Convention Committee that year and at the last minute they received a cancellation from the Sunday Spiritual Speaker and requested that I step in and replace her. I was angry, despondent, and unwilling due to Bob's death. John and Kathy both convinced me that under the circumstances, the best thing for me would be to speak about my loss and share Bob with the High Desert. Half mad at both of them, I didn't say, "No!" to their A.A. request and spoke. Thanks, John and Kathy, one more, time for pulling me out of my own head.

John had some problems after he hit the 20+ mark and last April he <u>"Re-"celebrated</u>" his 5 year A.A. anniversary. Thank God he made it back to us.

Space does not allow for continuing reminisce, so I will end with a prayer of gratitude for John Gallo, good and faithful friend to Alcoholics Anonymous – and me.

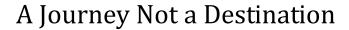

- Why do I need to be reminded of this so often?
- I think of myself as a fairly intelligent person. Why can't I remember this? Why won't they do it right?
- Why do I need to be obsessed by having expectations of others?

- My main benefit is I don't have to stay in the craziness that I create. I have learned here that I may get angry, but I don't have to stay there. If I have expectations of you, and you don't live up to them, I don't have to have a resentment over it.
- If I am upset for today, it is only for today, and I can choose to change my attitude at any time. It's up to me.
- I think one of the greatest gifts of the program is the gift of choice.
- I can choose my attitude at any time. You no longer "Do it to me." If I am angry, it is my fault and not yours. It is up to me to change it.
- You only control my feelings when I let you.
- Just for today I can feel as good as I set my mind to feel!
