CONCEPT ELEVEN

"The trustees should always have the best possible committees, corporate service directors, executives, staffs, and consultants. Composition, qualifications, induction procedures, and rights and duties will always be matters of serious concern."

The practical need of having A.A. matters delegated to bodies capable of performing them daily has already been discussed in Concepts II, VI and VIII. The spiritual advantage of delegation at this level, in keeping with the overarching goal of the Traditions and Concept Twelve, is that the very large amount of authority granted to the Trustees is divided among several committees, preventing an unchecked central power within A.A. Though they report to the Trustees, the executives and members of these service entities enjoy the rights of Decision, Participation and Appeal/Petition. These rights apply to any individual or entity performing service in A.A., allowing them relative freedom to use their own discretion. It is worth mentioning again at this time that, as Bill wrote while explaining the first one, these rights serve to balance authority and delegated responsibility and steer a course between the extremes of unlimited freedom for service members and giving them precise instructions

1. Call to Order

Meeting called to order 8:30 am. No prayer or traditions.

- Chair: Kara passed around sign-in sheet. No report.
- Co-Chair: Melissa Melissa was introduced as the new Office Manager. She started 9/16 and after going through various trays and drawers found tax papers, miscellaneous donations and other important documents, found money from various sources totaled \$1,308.46 which will be deposited initially in checking. The Bingo night in October had the necessary seed money approved (\$500). Money will also be needed to get the taxes done \$400. It was suggested that the safe should be upgraded. Chips need to be purchased if we continue to sell them. File cabinets are in several locations and the documents need to be reviewed and destroyed or kept as required. The bank account should have the office manager, chairperson, and treasurer on it. Waylon will file with the Secretary of State. The call forwarding shift from 4PM Saturday to 4PM Sunday is open and a volunteer is needed. Sandy D volunteered for today, the 21st, and Shelly volunteered for the next week. The back-office key has evidently been in a front desk drawer for quite some time. The office manager suggests that it be removed and retained only by the office manager and chairperson. And it was also suggested to relocate the cash box. Office volunteers will be filing a report at the end of each shift, and it was also earlier proposed that there be a duty roster of chores, such as vacuuming.
- Secretary: Doug change in Secretary from Doug to Sandy B noted in minutes.
- Treasurer: Shelly Treasurer reported the assets in checking and savings, and the income and expenses. There was a net decrease of \$134.69. Quotes for business checks were reported and it was decided to go with the Costco product. Canva has not been canceled yet. There is a need for itemized receipts for purchases--Walmart, etc. Treasurer added that she can't find checks 1066 up to 1073. Treasurer announced that the Ride for Recovery is requesting the customary seed money for the permit and application fees. Approximately \$250. This was approved. And it was also approved to put the flyer on the website.
- Newsletter: Sandy D, for Newsletter purposes needs access to the Intergroup directory and website. Individual donations, specifically Put Your Money Where Your Mouth Is (PYMWYMI), should again be encouraged.
- Webmaster: The long time Webmaster is planning to step down and a volunteer replacement is being sought.
- GSR: No report

- 3. Old Business None recorded.
- 4. New Business Melissa was introduced as new Office Manager. Her former board position will be vacant until the new bylaws are adopted noting that the ad hoc committee has not finished them yet. A new "Statement of Information" is needed. The minutes from August were read and a correction was noted that the Treasurer did not meet with a tax professional but with another member to help prepare for the actual meeting with the professional. The corrections were noted and the minutes were not approved. The next order of business was to remove the "acting" secretary. There has been no secretary since 2017 when that term ended, and because the bylaws state that board members can't succeed themselves. A new secretary was nominated and accepted. Sandy B is immediately assuming the position. There have been complaints about the meeting directory being too small. It was moved and passed that Sandy D will revamp the meeting directory including the removal of the Johns Hopkins "20 questions," which are not officially AA approved. This led to a brief discussion of what should and shouldn't be sold at Central Office. November is Gratitude Month. Waylon announced Canva is now canceled. Waylon's debit card to be shredded. Waylon talked with counseling offices of local colleges re. AA assisting as a resource for students with alcohol problems, but this was rejected. It was suggested and approved to send a note to all of the rejected applicants for the office manager job, thanking them for their interest and leaving the door open for future consideration.


