### STEP TWELVE

#### STEP CHECKLIST

- \*I have an alcoholic[ s] (sponsee s) that I am teaching how to take the 12 Steps and teaching them how to teach others to take them?
- \*I am willing today to understand the difference between sharing my experience and my opinion. (Thought behind this statement: "You can debate my opinion all you want to, but you can't debate my experience because it happened to me.")
- \*I am willing to go to any lengths today to maintain my spiritual condition.
- \*I am willing to go to any lengths today to carry this message to other alcoholics.
- \*I am willing to practice every one of the *spiritual principles* found in our 12 Steps: **HONESTY, HOPE, FAITH, COURAGE, INTEGRITY, WILLINGNESS, HUMILITY, LOVE, DISCIPLINE, PERSEVERANCE, AWARENESS AND SERVICE** in all my affairs today.

*If you can answer yes to these questions, you've likely taken this step*

### TRADITION TWELVE

*Long Form:* And finally, we of Alcoholics Anonymous believe that the principle of anonymity has an immense spiritual significance. It reminds us that we are to place principles before personalities; that we are actually to practice a genuine humility. This to the end that our great blessings may never spoil us; that we shall forever live in thankful contemplation of Him who presides over us all."

The foundation of this inventory is from the A.A. TRADITIONS CHECKLIST first published in the A.A. Grapevine

- \*Why is it a good idea for me to place the common welfare of all AA members before individual welfare? What would happen to me if AA as a whole disappeared?
- \*When I do not trust AA's current servants, who do I wish had the authority to straighten them out?
- \*In my opinions of and remarks about other AAs, am I implying membership requirements other than a desire to stay sober?
- \*Do I ever try to get a certain AA group to conform to my standards, not its own?
- \*Have I a personal responsibility in helping an AA group fulfill its primary purpose? What is my part?
- \*Does my personal behavior reflect the Sixth Tradition—or belie it?
- \*Do I do all I can do to support AA financially? When is the last time I anonymously gave away a Grapevine subscription?
- \*Do I complain about certain AAs' behavior—especially if they are paid to work for AA? Who made me so smart?
- \*Do I fulfill all AA responsibilities in such a way as to please privately even my own conscience? Really?
- \*Do my utterances always reflect the Tenth Tradition, or do I give AA critics real ammunition?
- \*Should I keep my AA membership a secret, or reveal it in private conversation when that may help another alcoholic (and therefore me)? Is my brand of AA so attractive that other drunks want it?
- \*What is the real importance of me among more than a million AAs?

### CONCEPT TWELVE

The *Conference* shall observe the spirit of A.A. tradition, taking care that it never becomes the seat of perilous wealth or power; that sufficient operating funds and reserve be its prudent financial principle; that it place none of its members in a position of unqualified authority over others; that it reach all important decisions by discussion, vote, and whenever possible, substantial unanimity; that its actions never be personally punitive nor an incitement to public controversy; that it never perform acts of government; that, like the Society it serves, it will always remain "democratic in thought and action."

#### CONCEPTS CHECKLIST

- How do we guard against becoming a "seat of perilous wealth or power"?
- How do we practice prudent use of our Seventh Tradition contributions and literature revenue?
- Do we insure the spiritual liberties of all A.A. members by not placing any member in the position of absolute authority over others?
- Do we try to reach important decisions by thorough discussion, vote and, where possible, substantial unanimity?
- As guardians of A.A.'s traditions, are we ever justified in being personally punitive?
- Are we careful to avoid public controversy?
- Do we always try to treat each other with mutual respect and love?

#### 1. Call to Order

Meeting was called to order 8:39 am by Melissa S. Shannon W prayed in with Serenity prayer.

#### 2. Intergroup Reports

- Treasurer: Shelly J - report is as follows:

Shelly J met with Stewart Business & Tax Service accountant in Barstow for 2022 tax return (990 EZ, Schedule O, e-sig, etc.). The fee was \$400.00 and Shelly J provided receipt. She mentioned there is an annual RRF1 form which is \$25 each year and Shelly J completed one for 2023 and check has not yet cleared. It was noted that taxes from 2019 – 2023 were not filed and that there is required paperwork that is needed to take care of which Shelly J is working on. Shelly J is also going through a lot of EDD paperwork to figure out what it is and will report out next month with findings. E-signature work is to be done as well. Shelly J paid 9/24 Recovery Mint in the amount of \$105.00. On 10/7 the Chase bank info was updated to: Shelly J, Treasurer, Kara K, Chair, and Melissa S as Office Manager.

Shelly J had a few comments and suggestions regarding the newsletter formatting which she shared. Sandy D informed the group that next month is "gratitude month."

Sandy B read the minutes from 9/21/24. It was noted that Shelly J submitted clarifications via email that Doug did not capture and Sandy B did not see via email. Discussion was held regarding those items and Linda V motioned to accept September minutes with corrections to be captured in October minutes. Shelly J seconded, AIF.





### 3. Old Business

Melissa S was introduced as new Office Manager. Her former board position will be vacant until the new bylaws are adopted noting that the ad hoc committee has not finished them yet. A new "Statement of Information" is needed. The minutes from August were read and a correction was noted that the Treasurer did not meet with a tax professional but with another member to help prepare for the actual meeting with the professional. The corrections were noted and the minutes were not approved. The next order of business was to remove the "acting" secretary. There has been no secretary since 2017 when that term ended, and because the bylaws state that board members can't succeed themselves. A new secretary was nominated and accepted. Sandy B is immediately assuming the position. There have been complaints about the meeting directory being too small. It was moved and passed that Sandy D will revamp the meeting directory including the removal of the Johns Hopkins "20 questions," which are not officially AA approved. This led to a brief discussion of what should and shouldn't be sold at Central Office. November is Gratitude Month. Waylon announced Canva is now canceled. Waylon's debit card to be shredded. Waylon talked with counseling offices of local colleges re. AA assisting as a resource for students with alcohol problems, but this was rejected. It was suggested and approved to send a note to all of the rejected applicants for the office manager job, thanking them for their interest and leaving the door open for future consideration.

### 4. New Business

Melissa S informed the committee that she learned we owe \$2151.99 for World Service literature from 2023 and she has received the invoices and confirmed legit. Shelly J requested that all invoices be reviewed and reconciled as something is not adding up. Melissa S will be doing this. Melissa Said Central Office may need new computers due to outdated technology. Halloweenbingo fundraiser is on Saturday, October 26<sup>th</sup> at 3:00 pm. Shelly J will talk with the District Office and see if they are able to support assisting with any funds to help support computer upgrades. Melissa S asked permission to join a HP ink ongoing service for \$6.99. Shelly J motioned to accept and to try it for 6 months and evaluate costs. Shannon seconded, AIF. Melissa S discussed phone times for volunteers and there is a need to find new coverage for Saturday call time due to a volunteer. Julia volunteered for Saturday all for every Saturday through end of year only and then re-evaluate. Melissa S received the debit card for manager role. She will be renewing Grapevine subscription that was expired. Directories have been updated and back in format and the website has been updated. Melissa Spoke with the Webmaster and he will be stepping down. Sandy D has been assisting with the website. Shelly J noted we have the following reoccurring bills that need to be set up for payment as well: Amazon Prime \$16.50 monthly, High Desert Alarm \$149 every three months and His Cox Insurance \$247.50 every 6 months. Melissa S will switch those over for payment. Melissa S said that there has been review and feedback from members of the Bylaws Committee that we need to reconsider the format and utilize a different format (perhaps similar to H&I) so that will be worked on in separate committee. Melissa S shared with the group a gift for Douq for his service and requested a check for Jennifer P for \$40 for the box. Melissa S issued check #1080 for Jennifer out of new checks. Sandy D suggested that general business office cards be made for those needing to hand publications out and it was decided that the stamp would suffice for now. Melissa S asked for volunteers for Saturday Bingo. Sandy B is doing a snack bar and Shelly J will assist. Melissa S has someone for the front desk. Volunteers are asked to be at VV Alano Club at 1:00 pm.

### 5. Close of Meeting

Shannon W motioned to adjourn, Linda seconded, AIF. Meeting adjourned at 9:58 am. Julia J prayed out with the Third Step Prayer at 9:58 am.

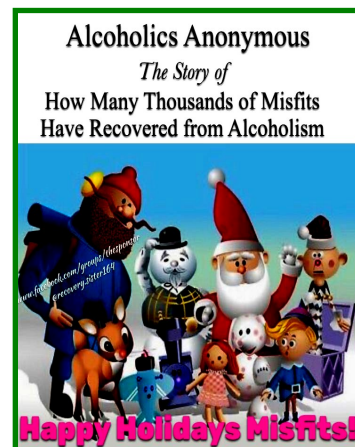
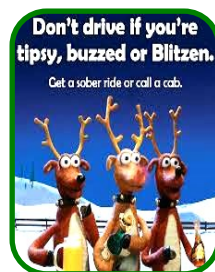
