- ◇ Develop a foundation of accountability and integrity for a new way of living.

In August at the regular business meeting the GSRs did not report for their groups. Instead, the committee had a guest. Ed L., the 2022 Delegate, from Wrightwood, delivered an educational, informational presentation on submitting Agenda Items (AI). AIs can be submitted on behalf of a person or group conscious. As written in the General Service Manual—"...an agenda item is a suggested proposal for action or discussion that has been submitted for consideration at the annual General Service Conference (G.S.C.). These items are intended to address matters of policy, conference-approved literature, or emerging issues that require the collective conscience of the A.A. Fellowship."

"The **JOURNEY** of an agenda item

**SUBMISSION:** Proposed agenda items are submitted through the service structure (groups to districts, districts to areas) or directly to the General Service Office (G.S.O.) in New York.

**Screening:** G.S.O. staff and the trustees' Conference Committee review the items. They assess them based on relevance, past Conference actions, and if they represent a broad group conscience.

**ED explained:** where to begin, he gave examples, and what happens to your AI, at the General Service Conference.

If you or your group desires to submit an AI, they are to be submitted to before the end of September.

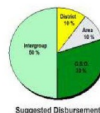
