Doing a thorough Fourth Step was hard, she says, but there's no feeling on earth quite as good as that

Who among us approached the Fourth Step with happy anticipation? No one, I suspect.

My alcoholic drinking days were approached with an overwhelming desire to crush my feelings of pain and disappointment. After all, from that first drink to the last, when numbness and oblivion were my only goals, my pursuit took me on a five-year journey that could be called one unholy binge.

I quickly became jobless, hopeless and helpless. Nothing and no one came before the drink I had when my eyes first opened in the morning, and I didn't stop pouring alcohol into my body until I passed out at night.

I vaguely remember overnight stops in jail. One memory I have is the look the guard had on his face as he let me go in the morning. His expression was one of contempt mixed with little understanding of how a young woman could let herself become such a despicable drunk. In no time I found a bottle of wine, and my daily routine began once again.

I can remember thinking to myself that a double standard was the source of a lot of my problems. After all, men could drink, holler at the moon and bed women of all types, and that was somehow OK. But God forbid women act the same way. Society sucked, and somehow that had become my problem.

Skip ahead to my first meeting of Alcoholics Anonymous. I'd entered a strange new world of people who, for their own reasons, decided to get sober. I was told that the Twelve Steps were the pathway to sobriety. I found a room full of strangers who put out their hands and welcomed me. It had been a very long time since I had been welcomed anywhere.

Sandy has been running payroll for Melissa for the last two months and created an employee file for her as well. That part seems to be working fine. Still being finalized is the tax submission process, Sandy is confident this will be resolved by 3/31/26. We have a new EDD account and corresponding Employer Payroll Tax Account Number. Sandy brought Melissa Labor Law posters that we are required to display at Central Office.

Sandy is having difficulty locating a provider for Workmen's Compensation coverage, many companies will not insure Alcoholics Anonymous. There is one last company she will reach out to that may issue coverage, Lamb Insurance. Melissa also agreed to contact the Inland Empire Central Office Manager to see who they use. Shelly sent Sandy IRS Form 990, which will be filed in May. The checking and savings account balances were reversed in January's meeting minutes, a correction was made and the minutes were approved. A \$1,000 transfer was made from savings to checking. Insurance bill in the amount of \$247.50 was paid, this expense is incurred every three months. Sandy mentioned she is keeping a closer eye on the bank account given that we now have additional expenses due to our employer status. Shelly J. motioned to have total expenses and total income reported in the minutes, Kim seconded, AIF.

Newsletter -. John D. will be adding a QR code to the Zelle article on page 3 of the newsletter. February's edition is ready for distribution.

Webmaster - Courtney Q - Absent. Report provided by Shelly. Everything is going well. There's a reference about Central Office making flyers for meetings and events. Group agreed this should

be deleted from the website. John D. offered to help anyone that reaches out but this is not a function of Central Office.

GSR - Shelly J. reported that Stacy H., treasurer for District 19, will be attending the 2026 Pacific Region AA Service Assembly (PRAASA). The assembly is being held February 27 to March 1, 2026, in Waikiki Beach, Oahu, HI. Leslie A., archivist, is interviewing 'old timers' to add stories to the archives. If you know of anyone that may be interested in participating, let Shelly know. H&I liaison is still vacant. Jerry M. is convention liaison.

Today's Seventh Tradition collected \$16.00.

Rosie will make the changes and provide a final copy for board member signatures at the March regular meeting. Discussion was had about adding the final document to our website. UPDATE: Rosie noted there's a reference to the by-laws on the home page but the link is not working.

Central Office Table at 2026 HD convention - Rosie made a motion to form a subcommittee for planning purposes. Melissa seconded, AIF. The subcommittee can organize/assign required tasks (i.e., schedule, inventory, payment options, etc.) and report back to the larger group. John D. and Celeste N. volunteered to participate.

Kim made motion to set a flat amount for donations to the three events coming up (Ride for Recovery, Women's Banquet, and HD Convention), Shelly seconded. AIF to donate up to \$150 in merchandise to each event.

Before long I found a home group and a sponsor named Carol and started working the Steps. I found a God of my understanding who I came to believe would go to any lengths to help me get sober.

The first three Steps came fairly easy for me, but the Fourth Step was something very different. It required not just willingness to believe, but also action on my part.

With the Big Book as my guide, I started to write down those people and circumstances I resented and the reasons I detested them so much. I wrote about how I was affected by them and how my life was all but destroyed. The writing of this inventory was one of the most difficult things I'd ever done. By my own hand, I revealed how a once happy, well-adjusted woman decided to destroy herself with alcohol.

As difficult as this task was, Step Four provided a way for me to share this information with someone else, and that act of sharing gave me some freedom from the burdens of my drunkenness.

Each of the Steps has helped to lead me to a sober life. The Fourth Step was for me one of the most important Steps because it opened a dam that needed to be opened, without which I could not attain contented sobriety.

My advice to anyone who reads about my experience with the Fourth Step is to not leave even a single "pebble" unturned. Do your very best. For me, the Fourth Step, coupled with the Fifth Step, left me feeling clean and light like winter's first fresh-fallen snow. There's no feeling on earth quite as good as that.
